

How we keep our workers and their whānau safe from COVID-19

Our staff in managed isolation facilities are essential workers in the fight against COVID-19 in Aotearoa. We're committed to keeping them and their whānau, loved ones and communities safe. Here's how...



Health

Our people:

- › use personal protective equipment (PPE), have great hygiene and practise physical distancing
- › have daily health checks and access to nursing staff who are on-site 24/7
- › don't come to work if they are unwell
- › are regularly tested for COVID-19.



Wellbeing

Our people:

- › are encouraged to look after their mental wellbeing
- › have access to professional support if they are feeling stressed or anxious.



Clean facilities

Our facilities are:

- › regularly cleaned with hospital grade disinfectant
- › audited by infection prevention experts
- › deep cleaned if any infection is suspected.



Returnees in facilities

All returnees:

- › receive information plus reminders on protecting their own and others' health throughout their 14-day stay
- › are tested around days 3 and 12.



Home and community

We ask our people to:

- › keep records of their movements and close contacts (just like all New Zealanders) while not at work
- › hold off hugging their loved ones at home until they have had a shower and changed clothes.



Strict rules and tight security

Safety and security matter:

- › our on-site staff include police, defence and security professionals
- › security is reviewed regularly.
